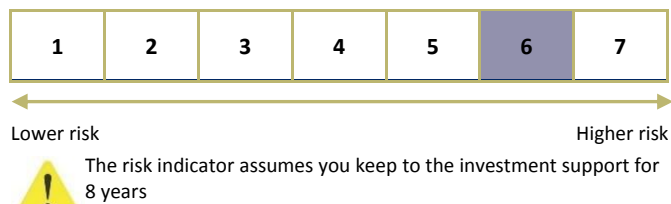

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You are about to purchase an investment support that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Objectives:	This investment support aims at a majority investment in financial instruments such as equities or similar instruments, in order to seek a high return. The risk of capital loss is also higher.
Intended retail investor:	The targeted investor for this investment support has an aggressive risk profile and is willing to accept a very high risk of significant depreciation of his portfolio while aiming for a very significant increase of his capital. This strategy fits investors having an extremely sound knowledge of the financial markets.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



Risk indicator:
